The solution required the change of a record layout which is defined in CSD0301; and									
The text about rereads in CSD202 also needs to be changed.									

If a meter reading is rejected as being out of range but on investigation the reading is found to be correct the normal course of action is send the reading again but with a Re-Read flag. The Current T17 does not permit this to happen. This matter was identified before go live in April 2008 however the correction was not implemented at the time as it required an amendment to a dataflow and dataflows were subject to a change freeze.

There have been more than 50 occurrences of this problem since go-live; the problem is enduring will continue to occur unless corrective action is taken. The manual workaround is time consuming and has many disadvantages.

- It causes the EWA to be automatically recalculates using industry averages and overwrites the current EWA value that is generally based on meter reading.
- It necessitates SW to use the LVI instead of the HVI with consequential knock-on effect on efficiency audibility and risk of manual error.
- The CMA experiences calls from LPs who were expecting a different record sequence to the one received.
- The data held in the CMA system does not reflect the field activity.

The current workaround:

- Requires a disproportionate amount of effort to correct a regularly occurring problem;
- Is neither simple, cost-effective or secure; and
- Is detrimental to Scottish Water core functions as it is a barrier to efficient meter activity

It is proposed to modify the system to accept a Re-Read indicator (field D3012) which may be used when required.

The change

- Is a proportionate response to a regularly occurring problem;
- Is simple to implement and to use
- Will enhance the accuracy of data that affects wholesale charging;
- Removes the need for a workaround that is currently detrimental to the Market Code Objectives and Principles; and
- Does not have any adverse effect on other Market Code Objectives and Principles.

This change has an impact on the Central System and SW systems. It does not appear to have a direct impact on LP's systems.

The change affects the HVI interface between the CMA and SW.

The change effect business processes for SW; it replaces a time consuming workaround with a simple correction activity which follows the same approach used for sending a Re-read for a meter removal.

The change effect business processes for LPs as it removes the ad-hoc activity of following up why T17.1 data flows have not been received.
