A.2. MCCP/OCCP DETAILS

A.2.a. ISSUE OR DEFECT WHICH THIS MCCP / OCCP SEEKS TO ADDRESS Required under Market Code Parts 8.7.1 (ii) (b) and 8.8.1 (ii) (b)

The Vacancy Admin Scheme, as described in MCCP091, was introduced in 2012 to allow Scottish Water to challenge the occupancy status of SPIDs. By use of the T034 group of transactions, Scottish Water were able to submit evidence to support such a challenge which could then be assessed by the relevant LP and, if successful, would lead to the vacancy flag being re-set on the relevant SPIDs.

The intent of the Vacancy Admin Scheme was to ensure that all wholesale charges that should properly accrue should be duly identified, in particular, when a SPID had been flagged as being vacant, but may in fact have been consuming water and sewerage services.

In the first 2 years after its introduction, the Scheme was used in respect of some 4,400 SPIDs (resulting in a change of vacancy status in some 528 instances). However, the Scheme was only used 15 times in 2014/15 (with no subsequent vacancy flag changes) and has not been used since.

Furthermore, the issue of wholesale charges and vacancy status has since been more fundamentally addressed via the vacancy charging arrangements, introduced in 2017 (MCCP204 – CC and MCCP207 – CC). Under these arrangements, a number of charges continue to apply when a SPID is flagged as vacant and where consumption can be identified during a period of vacancy, volumetric charges also apply.

Consequently, the T034 transactions and associated processing arrangements, along with the CSD drafting governing the use of the Vacancy Admin Scheme has become redundant and this proposal seeks its discontinuation.

A.2.b. DESCRIPTION OF THE NATURE AND PURPOSE OF THE MCCP / OCCP AND HOW IT MEETS THE MARKET CODE / OPERATIONAL CODE OBJECTIVES AND PRINCIPLES FOR THE MARKET DOCUMENTS

General Description

The removal of the Vacancy Admin Scheme and its processing in the CMA CS will simplify the Market Code arrangements, simplify the LVI and HVI and will reduce the costs and risks associated with future developments of the CMA CS. In particular, if this proposal were to be delivered in the October 2019 Release, the costs associated with the re-development of the LVI are anticipated to be lower than if this were not to be the case.
